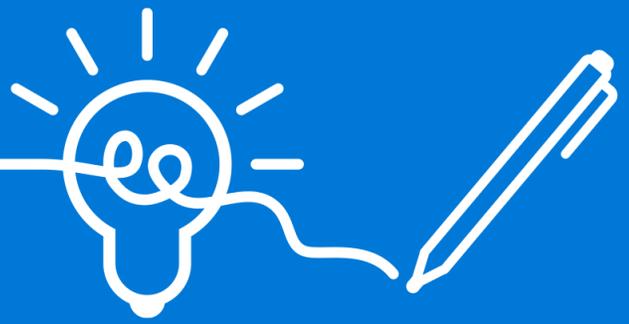


MIE Design, Redefine, Align Academy



Description

This two-day workshop uses design thinking principles to explore how Microsoft tools can transform learning environments. This training is designed for educators who have some working knowledge of Office 365 and the host of Microsoft tools embedded in Office 365. On the first day, educators will learn about the design thinking process, identify pain points (or challenges) students and teachers regularly experience, and prioritize the challenges the group wants to redefine. The remainder of day 1 and all of day 2 will focus on using the design thinking process to redefine six different experiences that interfere with teaching and learning. In each transformation module, educators will explore how Microsoft tools can offer solutions to the challenges teachers have chosen to redefine.

- Experience hands-on activities and participate in best practice conversations for innovating teaching with Microsoft tools
- Develop resources to use with students and colleagues
